International Medical Graduate Specialists (IMGS): The Board approved the membership of the FPM IMGS Committee and the appointment of an IMGS interview panel.

2013 Budget: The Faculty was in a positive position against budget at the end of the second quarter.

Build the curriculum and knowledge

Education

Education Committee Membership: Board approved the appointment of Professor Edward (Ted) Shipton as Chair of the Education Committee.

Supervisor of Training ratification: Dr Richard Talbot was appointed supervisor of training for the Geelong Hospital, Pain Management Unit, Victoria.

Exit Questionnaire: Board approved a revised Exit Questionnaire and an amendment to FPM Regulation 3.1.3.3 so that a completed Exit Questionnaire for each individual unit at which the trainee has undertaken training toward the structured training period must be submitted to obtain Fellowship by Training and Examination.

In-training Assessment Form: Board approved a revised In-Training Assessment form which was updated to include Tier 2 units.

FPM Online Pain Management Education Program: The Faculty aims to progress the Online Pain Management Education Initiative. Housing the education modules on a new learning platform at ANZCA will make the education more accessible to the broader medical community, including allied health and primary health care professionals. The longer term plans of the Faculty provide for further review and expansion of content to ensure it remains up to date and relevant.

The benefits of the extended program include; a broader reach for learning as members of the medical, or allied health, groups can potentially access the program via arrangements with their own peak professional body's online learning systems; provision of the latest learning in pain management, content revision can be made in one centralized location and users will have access to expanded content as it is developed. The program will be overseen by a working group of the Education Committee of the Faculty.

In August, as a result of the advocacy of PainAustralia and the Hon Tanya Plibersek, then Minister for Health and Minister for Medical Research, the Department of Health and Ageing has provided funding to advance pain medicine education. Australian Medicare Locals Alliance (AMLA) will facilitate the funding. The Faculty expects to receive funds toward the development of the Online Pain Management Education Program. A contract is currently under negotiation with the AMLA. Letters of thanks have been sent to PainAustralia and former Minister Tanya Plibersek.

Curriculum Redesign Project: Subsequent to an interim analysis of the FPM Curriculum Redesign Project conducted by consultants MetaPM, the Board approved a revised governance structure and terms of reference for the Project Governance Group and the Project Steering Group. A re-plan with revised scope, timeline, resource requirements and budget was presented for review and was approved. Project management capacity and capability has been strengthened. ANZCA's Strategic Project Office will now be accountable for the curriculum redesign's project management support. Examination

Pre-Examination Short Course: The course was held from 13-15 September 2013 in Brisbane with 28 candidates registered. Sincere appreciation goes to the conveners Dr Frank Thomas and Dr Richard Pendleton for the coordination of this successful course.

2013 Examination: The written examination will be held on 8 November 2013 in the regions including Hong Kong and Singapore. The clinical examination will be held from 23-24 November at the Geelong Hospital, Victoria. Registrations closed on Monday 23rd September. Thirty three candidates have registered to sit the exam.

Continuing Professional Development

Advancing CPD Project: ANZCA and FPM's continuing professional development (CPD) program has been revised to align with modern developments in CPD and in response to the changing medical regulatory environment facing specialist anaesthetists and specialist pain medicine physicians. The Advancing CPD Project was established to review the CPD program to ensure it meets these requirements and that activity entry is easy, automated where possible, and available on any device. FPM CPD Officer, Dr Penny Briscoe and FPM CPD Chair, Dr Michael Vagg have been involved in the development of the program. At the August meeting, Board endorsed the principle that FPM Fellows should undertake CPD that is at least comparable in nature and standard to the ANZCA CPD Program, and which includes a substantial commitment to pain medicine CPD. The Board endorsed the principle that the current ANZCA CPD project should continue to be shaped with input from FPM Fellows.

Tools to support Fellows completing their CPD activities are being developed. Non-FANZCA FPM Fellows should note that consideration of requirements to meet their full CPD needs continue under active discussion.

Research

Electronic Persistent Pain Outcomes Collaboration (ePPOC): The ePPOC pilot commenced on 16 August 2013 in a staged implementation at eleven sites across New South Wales. Additional sites in Victoria, Queensland, Western Australia and New Zealand have also expressed interest and will be involved in the early implementation. A [media release](#) was circulated on 20 August 2013. As the project expands, the Faculty will maintain its pivotal role through representation on the National Reference Group which will oversee ePPOC for the first 12 months, and subsequently on the Management Advisory Board or Clinical and Scientific Advisory Committee.

Pain Device Implant Registry: A high level business plan for seeking 4 year industry funded support for this Faculty initiative was presented at a forum of key stakeholders including industry, Medical Technology Association of Australia (MTAA) and the Australian Commission on Safety and Quality in Health Care (ACSQHC) at ANZCA House on 9 September 2013. There was strong support for this initiative with an appropriate governance structure. The Faculty now intends to plan and sequence the actions needed to progress this initiative as a matter of priority.

Publications

Acute Pain Management Scientific Evidence 4th edition: Board approved a working group, terms of reference and business plan for the Acute Pain Management: Scientific Evidence 4th edition. It is anticipated that the publication will be launched at the 2015 ASM.

Relationships

Australasian Faculty of Rehabilitation Medicine: The AFRM 2013 Annual Scientific Meeting will take place in Sydney from the 17-20 September 2013. There is a strong pain presence in the program. A half day workshop will be held on running pain programs.

Australasian Chapter of Palliative Medicine: The Board noted the President's May 2013 Communiqué.

Professional

Submissions: The Faculty contributed to the joint ANZCA/FPM Good Medical Practice: A Code of Conduct for Doctors in Australia (May 2013), the RANZCOG accreditation assessment (July 2013), Consultation on the HWA International Medical Graduate Orientation and Supervision Discussion Paper (August 2013).

Essential Pain Management: The Board noted A/Prof Roger Goucke successful funding application to Perpetual Limited.

National Pain Strategy: A report from the ACI NSW showed significant achievement over the year, with new clinics established in Orange, Tamworth and Port Macquarie. A new private clinic has been established in Brisbane.
